
Topic: Sorting (shapes)



Content


Shapes can be many different colors and sizes. When we sort shapes, we put shapes that are the same in one group. For example, here are some shapes:

In the dining room we can find the dining room table and chairs, carpet, spoons, forks, knives and plates.


In the living room we can find a sofa, chair, table, television and carpet.




Topic: Sorting (size)

POSITIONAL WORDS


Topic: Up and Down

Objectives: By the end of this lesson you will be able to:


- follow directions using positional vocabulary.




