LETTER RECOGNITION

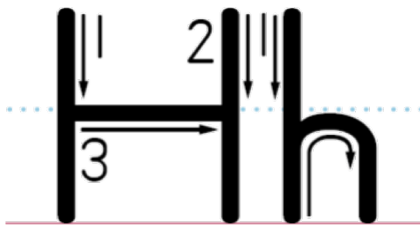
Topic: Letter Hh

Objective: By the end of this lesson you will be able to:

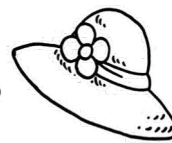
1. say the initial /h/ sound.

SHAPE

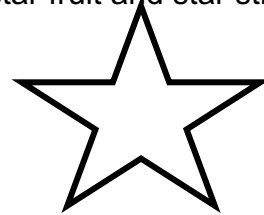
Topic: Star

COUNTING

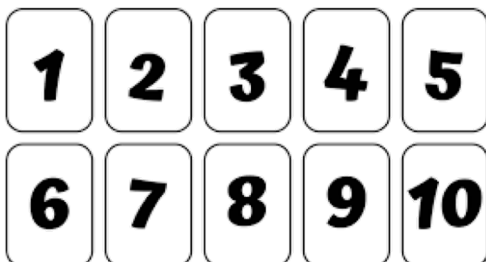
Topic: Rote Counting to 10

white snowflake

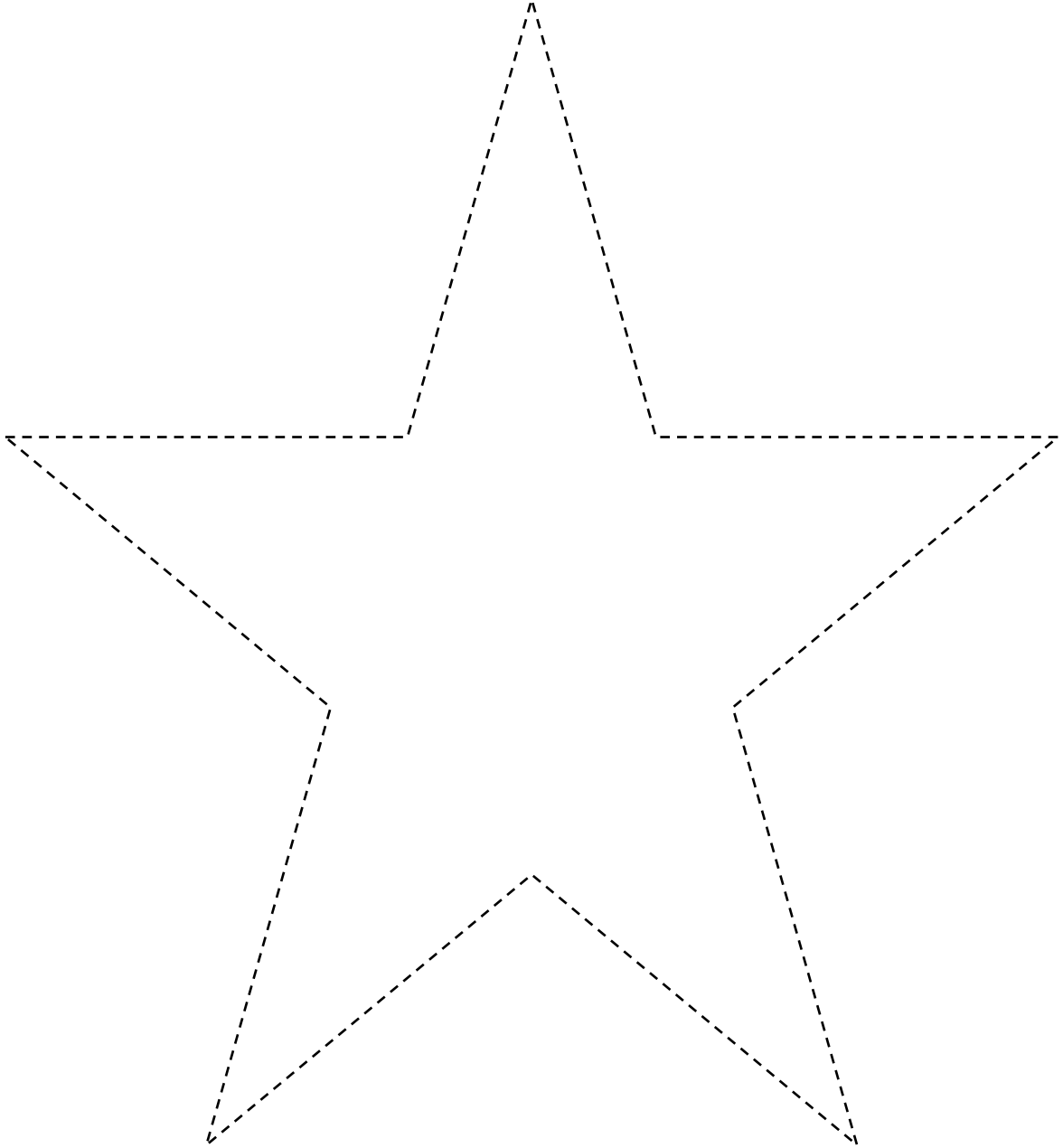


Tall and Short

Science Experiment

Topic: Candy Cane Experiment

Objectives: By the end of this lesson you will be able to:

1. predict what will happen to candy canes in different water temperatures.
2. observe the changes of an object.

Content

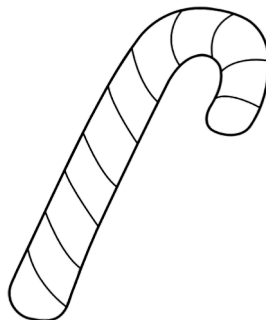
To compared how fast things dissolve, we can place them in different temperatures of water.

Materials

- 3 mini candy canes
- 3 containers
- water of various temperatures (warm, room temperature, cold)
- stopwatch/clock

Procedure:

1. Add water to each of your containers at different temperatures (warm, room temperature and cold water)
2. Make a prediction. Which temperature will dissolve the candy cane the fastest? Any ideas why?
3. Add a mini candy cane to each of the containers.
4. Start your stopwatch and/or record the start time.
5. Observe what happens.
6. Check your experiment every so often and note any changes.
