
Topic: Letter Kk

Content



Topic: Conch Salad

Objectives: By the end of this lesson you will be able to:

1. name ingredients used to make conch salad .

2. combine ingredients to make conch salad after following instructions.

Content

The adult queen conch is popular in The Bahamas. It is used to make conch salad which is a native dish.

Directions

- Wash conch with a mixture of lemon, salt and water.
- Clean the conch, remove slime, and cut into small cubes.
- Place conch in the mixing bowl.
- Clean other ingredients and cut in small cubes and place in the mixing bowl.
- Cover and let the conch and vegetables marinate in refrigerator for 15 minutes.
- Add salt, lime and orange juice for taste.
- Mix and serve.

Ingredients

- 8 oz pre-tenderized conch
- 10 tbsp fresh lime juice
- 5 tbsp fresh orange juice
- 1 ripe tomato, diced
- 1/4 cup diced onion
- 1 cucumber peeled, seeded and diced
- · 1/2 cup bell peppers (any color), diced
- · Salt and pepper to taste



- 2. identify words beginning with the letter Yy.


Content



Content





Objectives: By the end of this lesson you will be able to:


1. name beaches in The Bahamas.

Content

A beach is a pebbly or sandy shore. Most beaches can be found by the sea between high and low water marks. Materials such as sand, pebbles, rocks, and seashell fragments cover beaches. Even seaweed and marine organisms like crabs can be found on beaches.

Some beaches in our country are Saunders Beach, Jaws Beach, Goodman's Bay, Long Wharf Beach, Tropic of Cancer Beach in Exuma, Galloway Beach in Long Island, Ten Bay Beach in Eleuthera and Treasure Cay Beach in Abaco.
